Good Morning Mister Turner

PRINTS AND DRAWINGS BY NIALL NAESSENS



Following inclusion in the annual exhibition of Turner watercolours in the National Gallery of Ireland earlier this year, Irish printmaker, Niall Naessens brings his Good Morning Mister Turner exhibition to Siamsa Tíre. The exhibition will include a series of etchings and drawings by Naessens constituting a meditation on landscape, inspired by the work of J.M.W. Turner.

Naessens has long been interested in the work of the great nineteenthcentury artist Turner. Responding to the Gallery's collection of Turner watercolours, Naessens acknowledges the unavoidable influence that the artist exerts over the field of landscape today. He approaches Turner's work obliquely, not as images to be imitated or even interpreted, but as a means of looking at the landscape.
